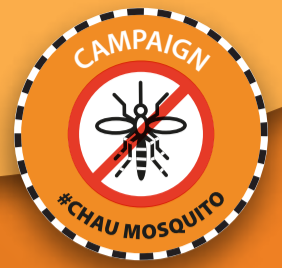




DENGUE Y CHIKUNGUNYA ALERT

From March to May: major outbreaks and epidemics







Although we associate mosquitoes to the warm seasons and summer, the truth is that mosquitoes keep reproducing themselves until the cold comes.

From March to May there are major outbreaks and epidemics of dengue



The eggs withstand low temperatures and droughts, and go through winter waiting for the arrival of heat and spring rains to develop.

HOW TO PROTECT US FROM STINGS?

-  Wearing light clothing that cover our arms and legs.
-  Placing mosquito nets on windows and tulle in cribs, beds and strollers to protect babies and young children.
-  Using DEET-based body repellents or Icaricina, especially in the morning and in the evening, the time when mosquitoes are most active.
-  Using environmental repellents on anyone of its formats: liquids, tablets or spirals.

We always recommend reading the repellent labels and following the instructions, since each type is placed and used differently.





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Use of repellents with children

It is the adults who must place the repellents to children, to prevent them from handling the product.



In case of spray or aerosol (in this case you must shake it previously), spray at a distance of 15 to 20 centimeters of skin and clothing, from side to side.



If it is a cream, you should use your hands to spread it uniformly on the skin, remembering to also apply it on the ankle and elbow area.



On the face, repellents should be applied carefully, placing them first in the palm of the hand to then apply the product on the face and behind the ears.

Totally avoid eye area and mouth, cuts, wounds, irritated skin or solar burnt skin.



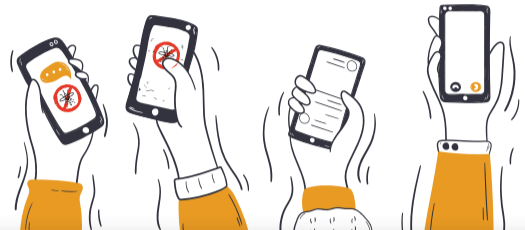
